COMMUNITY ADVISORY PANEL
MEETING SUMMARY
2-20-07**

Ann Howard opened the meeting at 6:05. The agenda for this meeting included feedback on the Community Input Group and planning for 2007. The CAP welcomed new members Dick and Sandie Owen. Ann briefly explained the role of the CAP and gave them copies of the CAP mission statement and operating guidelines.

FMC UPDATE

Patt Fagan noted that Dana Thompson, the new plant manager apologized for not being able to attend the meeting. Patt said that Dana looks forward to working with the CAP.

Since most of the environmental issues are covered in the meetings of the Middleport Community Input Group, Patt briefly reviewed the early actions planned for 2007, including remediation of the Coe property, and phase two of the railroad property remediation. She also explained that the water treatment plant would be upgraded.

AGENCY UPDATE

Mike Hinton reported that 46 letters were to be mailed to property owners in the air deposition study area. These letters will explain that no further action will be required on these properties. In addition 6 properties were found to have arsenic in the soils, but the source is not FMC. Mike briefly outlined the history of the FMC remediation project and explained the role of the agencies for our new members.

FEEDBACK ON THE MIDDLEPORT COMMUNITY INPUT GROUP

CAP members felt that generally the CIG is working well and that some progress has been made. There is still some concern about the agency position on many aspects of the project. It was noted that is reassuring to know that there may be monies available for redevelopment projects in conjunction with the environmental work. It was also noted that it is good to have the CAP and the Middleport Remediation Action Group working together. The Community Input Group was scheduled to meet again on March 1 and CAP members indicated they planned to attend.
