MEETING SUMMARY

Ann Howard opened the meeting at 6:05. The agenda for this meeting included an update on FMC's Price Protection Program and a tour of the 3ME area. Dana Thompson introduced John Burnsky and Bill Yantz, two plant employees who work in the 3ME area and who led the CAP tour of this area.

**PRICE PROTECTION PROGRAM UPDATE**

Sharrie Wartell provided a brief overview and history of the program. Sharrei reported that there have been 76 properties in the program overall and that she is working with a steady stream of applicants. Sharrie reviewed program statistics in the four phases of the program: S. Vernon and Main St., Tributary and Culvert area, Air Deposition Area, Additional Air Deposition Area. As of the date of the meeting, 6 sales were pending.

**FMC UPDATE**

Dana Thompson reported on recent contributions FMC has made on behalf of the community, including three scholarships to Roy-Hart Senior High students, and a donation to the Middleport Library. In addition, FMC will be storing some historic railroad cars for the Medina Railroad Museum.

Dana also reported FMC opened it neighborhood office at 17 Vernon Street to accommodate residents who have questions regarding remediation activities and to provide a place for residents during the day when properties are being excavated.

The plant is experiencing a busy production schedule and as a result three new positions are being added. Dana also announced other new hires for process engineer and maintenance engineer.

Dana reviewed the plans for remediation projects for Park/Maple Avenue, the railroad property adjacent to the plant (FMC property), the Coe property and Culvert 105. Dana also announced that no further vapor intrusion investigation would be required at the school. In addition, the NYS DEC has determined that groundwater migration at the plant has been controlled.

**FUTURE MEETINGS**

The next CAP meeting is tentatively scheduled for September 19, 2007, pending determination of Community Input Group meetings.
